In Memory of Trevor George Barr

(1961-2022)

Trevor Barr, a former Director of Music at Warwick School, died recently as the result of a sudden heart attack. He was a popular, charismatic figure and was well known on the local music scene as pianist, organist, and choirmaster. His talents were in great demand by churches and choirs both locally and further afield.

Trevor was an inspirational teacher. Using humour and gentle persuasion he had the exceptional ability to motivate musicians and choristers of all ages and talents to perform to the very best of their ability.

Born in Londonderry, N. Ireland, Trevor had an irrepressible drive and vitality that took him into other areas of life, not just music. Amongst other things he had a strong interest in politics and recently stood as a candidate in local County Council elections.

Trevor is sorely missed by all who knew him. He had a remarkable and rare talent combined with humour, heartening optimism, and unconditional friendship.
