

Over 400 years ago this astounding work marked the end of the Renaissance and the beginning of the Baroque. The publication in 1610 almost certainly helped Monteverdi gain the prestigious post of maestro di cappella at St Mark's in Venice, which he would keep until his death in 1643.


Travel through time from 1123 to the present day as Da Capo celebrates the 900th anniversary of the founding of the Collegiate Church of St Mary.
